James L. Wayman received the Ph. D. degree in engineering in 1980 from the University of California, Santa Barbara and joined the Mathematics faculty at the U. S. Naval Postgraduate School in 1981. He became a full-time biometrics consultant to the Department of Defense in 1986. He joined San Jose State University in 1994, serving as Director of the U.S. National Biometrics Test Center from 1997 to 2000. He was a co-founder of the NSF Citer project at West Virginia University and a member of the National Academy of Science committees "Authentication Technologies and their Implications for Privacy" and "Whither Biometrics?" He is a Fellow in the IEEE and the U.K. Institution of Engineering and Technology and an Honorary Professor of Biometrics at the University of Kent. He is a member of the British National Body within ISO/IEC SC 37 and has served as a paid biometrics advisor to 11 national governments. He has been a consultant on the Australian SmartGate program since 2002.
